It's important – Spending just a few minutes to fill out your census form will help ensure Altadena receives its fair share of Federal and State funding and is crucial to planning decisions that affect your community. Census data is used to determine funding for neighborhood improvements, public health, education, transportation, and much more. The data is also used to define districts and important planning boundaries.

It's confidential – Your responses are protected by law and take only a few minutes to answer and return by mail. All Census Bureau employees have taken an oath to protect confidentiality and are subject to jail terms, fines, or both, for disclosing any of your personal information. The Census Bureau will mail or deliver questionnaires to your house in March 2010.

LIVING IN UNINCORPORATED ALTADENA

You are represented by the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors which is responsible for establishing policies and regulations that affect you and your fellow Altadena residents. In Altadena, the role of the local city government is performed by the County who is responsible for providing and maintaining municipal services such as law enforcement, firefighting, road maintenance, parks, zoning, building permits, and animal care and control.

The unincorporated areas of the County are governed by the Board of Supervisors, who serve as your "City Council". Your local field representative contact information can be found on page 2.

LYNNE MCDANIEL DOOLITTLE HOME

In 1912, artist Harold Lukens Doolittle designed a home for Vroman's Bookstore President and a patron of the arts, George Howell. Although Doolittle was better known for his etchings, photography, and furniture design, he created a beautiful Craftsman with intricate woodwork and an intriguing floor plan. Today, the home is largely intact, and occupied by noted artist Lynne McDaniel.

ELENA KELLOGG STUDIO

In 1913, publishing magnate, Frederick W. Kellogg commissioned architect Charles Buchanan to design a special Craftsman studio in the garden of his Millionaire's Row estate for his daughter an accomplished painter Elena. His mansion was demolished in the 1950s, but the little studio remains tucked in a cul-de-sac, practically unchanged.

RICHARD DAVIES HOME

Richard Davies and his close friends, fellow Altadena artists and scientists, Jirayr Zorthian, Richard Feynman, and Albert Hibbs, frequently gathered at his bungalow for sessions of intense, exciting intellectual discourse and memorable artistic events. Davies, a retired JPL scientist, took up avant-garde painting and created large, intensely colored paintings of the "imagined extensions of earth's landscape".

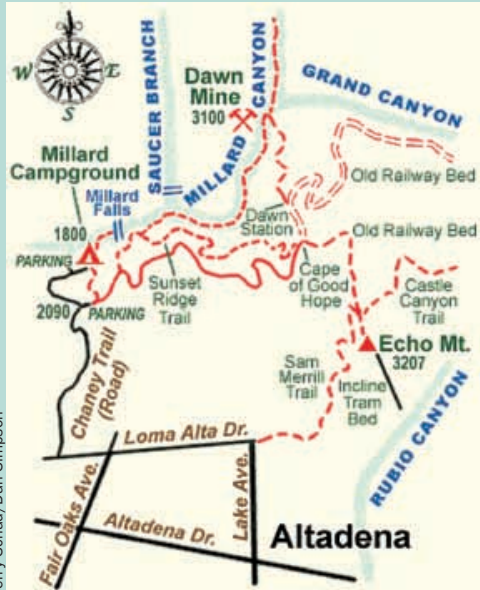

TAKE ADVANTAGE OF ALTADENA'S SPECTACULAR HIKING TRAILS!

Altadena's close proximity to the San Gabriel Mountains offers local residents a number of hiking opportunities and attracts hiking enthusiasts from throughout Southern California. Several short trails are accessible from the Eaton Canyon Nature Center, including a 1.5-mile hike to Eaton Canyon Falls. Visit the Nature Center or www.ecnca.org for more information on hiking options in Eaton Canyon. Other popular hiking locations in the Altadena area include Millard Canyon which is accessible from Cheney Trail off of Loma Alta Drive, and Echo Mountain via the Sam Merrill Trail (accessible from the top of Lake Avenue) which features the ruins of the historic Mount Lowe Railway. 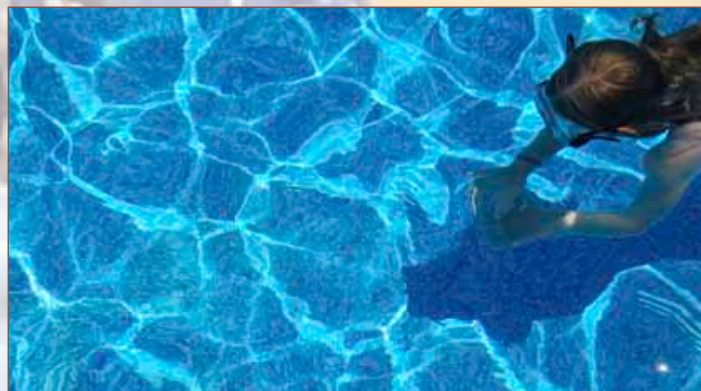

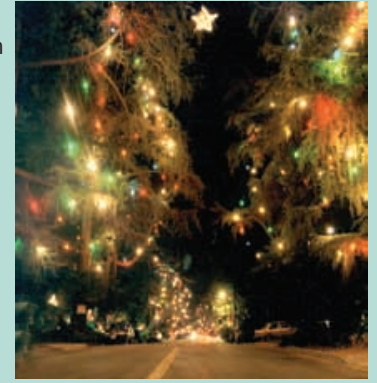
CHRISTMAS TREE LANE: CONTINUING ALTADENA'S OLDEST TRADITION FOR THE FUTURE

The lighting of the trees during the holiday season along Santa Rosa Avenue is the oldest large-scale holiday lighting spectacle in California. However, it is dependent upon the Christmas Tree Lane Association (CTLA) and community volunteers in order to continue. Your help is urgently needed! This year, CTLA has embarked on a program to become more energy-efficient, or "green" by gradually replacing the current incandescent light bulbs with ones that use LED (light emitting diode) technology. LED bulb lenses use impact resistant, durable plastic instead of glass so they are considered more permanent and would reduce the number of damaged bulbs.

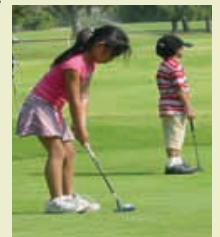

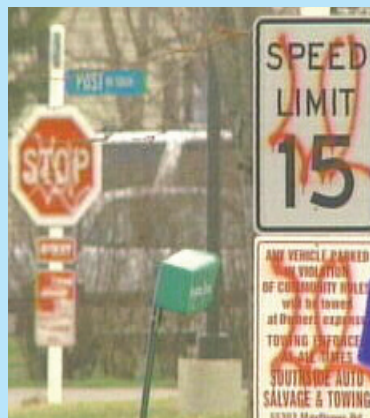

PREVENT SWIMMING POOL ACCIDENTS AND INJURY!

The County of Los Angeles Fire Department wants everyone to remember to exercise safety during any water recreational activity. Drowning accidents are the leading cause of death for children one to four years of age. It takes **JUST A FEW SECONDS** for a life to be lost or serious injuries to occur if children are not under the watchful eyes of an adult in or around a swimming pool!



Follow these safety tips to prevent accidental drowning or injury:

- NEVER allow children to be alone near water. Make sure a responsible adult is present at all times to supervise children's activities.
- DO NOT leave children unattended for any length of time (not even a few seconds) to talk on the telephone, read or do any other activities that will distract you from attentive supervision of children.
- The Los Angeles County swimming pool "Fencing" ordinance requires that all swimming pools more than two feet in depth be surrounded by a protective fence of not less than five feet high. Secure the pool fence at all times.
- Keep toys out of the pool or pool area when not in use and keep items that children may use to climb into pool areas in a secure place.
- Mount approved flotation devices near the pool. Remember toy flotation devices are **NOT** lifesaving devices!
- Know the depth of the water before you attempt to dive. Remember, never dive into an above-ground pool.
- Keep a telephone near the pool in case of an emergency.

COMMUNITY EMERGENCY RESPONSE TRAINING (CERT) TO PREPARE YOU FOR A DISASTER!



The CERT Program consists of a curriculum designed to teach basic disaster response and emergency preparedness skills to cities and communities. Since 2003, the County of Los Angeles Fire Department has proudly presented this training to the general public in order to help communities be ready immediately following a disaster.

Following a major disaster, police, fire, and medical professionals may not be able to fully meet the demand of the public. People will have to rely on each other to meet the immediate life-saving and life-sustaining needs, particularly in neighborhoods that may be cut off from the main roads for a period of time. In the event of a disaster, CERT will help volunteers have the skills and tools necessary to take care of themselves, their families, neighbors, and co-workers when professional responders are not immediately available; support emergency response agencies in emergency preparedness in their community; and become part of the disaster plan for local authorities.

TIPS TO SAVE MONEY AND WATER

With the driest season on record, water conservation should be a high priority for all residents. Here are 5 easy and effective ways to save water at home and in the garden:



1. Adjust your sprinklers. Up to 70 percent of residential water use goes to maintaining our yards. Try taking a little time off the timer.

2. Fix those leaks. Just a drip can waste more than 10,000 gallons per month. A leaking flapper on a toilet also increases flows at the water treatment plant.

3. Plant native species or drought-tolerant plants. Many of the lawns and plants we use are not intended for the unique climate in Southern California.

4. Turn off the water while you brush your teeth or shave, and take shorter showers.

5. Eliminate runoff. Runoff could mean your lawn needs aeration. When you aerate your lawn, you give the water somewhere to go besides down the storm drain.

PRESERVING OUR URBAN FORESTRY

More than 13,000 parkway trees in Altadena are maintained by DPW’s Urban Forestry Division. There are about 3,500 “fast growth” trees that are trimmed on average, every two years. Fast growth species include Jacaranda, Chinese Elm, Sweet Gum, and Carrotwood. There are also about 6,700 “slow growth” trees that are trimmed approximately every five years. Slow growth species include Magnolia, Coast-like Oak, and Crape Myrtle. In addition, DPW maintains about 2,800 palm trees in the Altadena area which are trimmed every two years.

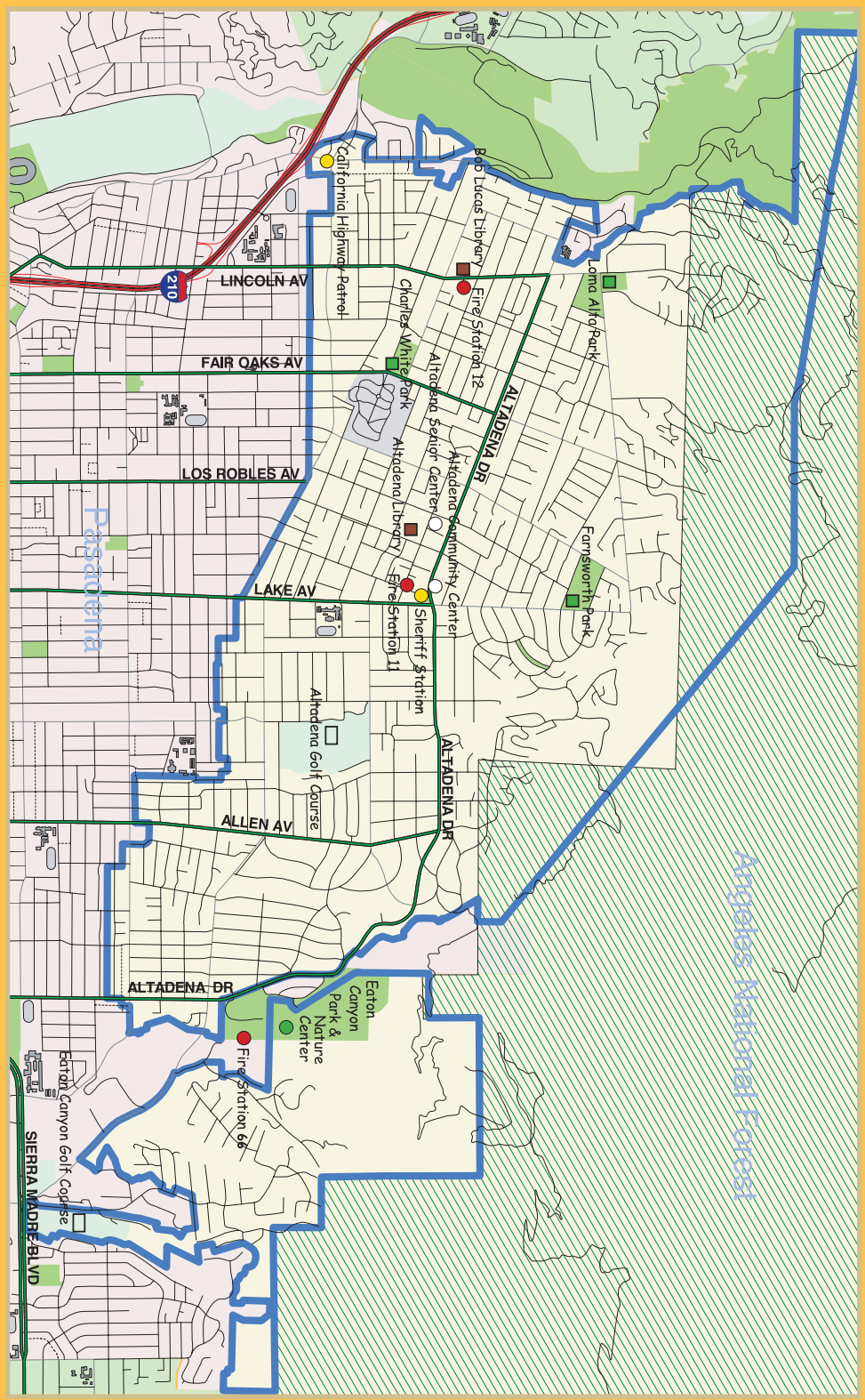
